Program review is a highly flexible process that reveals the work already done and provides a platform to share this work with others. APR also provides opportunities for program improvement. The purpose of APR is to assess programs for effectiveness, identify adjustments and provide a mechanism to implement changes. Outcomes from the process include:

- Enrich disciplinary communities of practice through sustained collaborative engagement
- Clarify program mission and goals
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- Optimize program development and improvement

Faculty and management collaboratively develop an improvement plan, listing opportunities, barriers, resources and support needed.


