Ive been kicking around the idea of trying to figure out how we might possibly build some collaborative programming between LLC and Arts surrounding journalism, and would love to talk to some Arts folks. Karen Krumrey in Communications has a journalism background (part of her grad studies), but no bandwidth to do much right now. There has also been some interest expressed in other parts of my division, and Ive got a line on a very solid community journalism and news writing person (he also works in film journalism and creative journalism) that could really open up some spectacular programming. Can we all get together sometime early in the spring to throw around some ideas?

Among the longer-term things Ive been thinking about are the fact that there seems to be significant student interest in the field, and we have the school at the UO right next door. Ive even thought about the possibility of summer programming, etc. I see a lot of potential in this area to be able to offer students something distinctive. Ive been underwater with my own kettle of fish for most of the year, but it seems like the zeitgeist is pointing in this direction.

> It does seem that Journalism would benefit from APR; I'm wondering if this might be a chance for the program to work with Media Arts to integrate and even update the program given the focus on digital journalism and social media as platforms for news creation/dissemination? We don't have the Journalism program listed on our own list of APR programs, and I know similar small programs such as Film and French have worked on collaborative APRs (with Literature and Spanish respectively).

> Alternatively (or maybe even additionally?), it does seem that the Torch would be a good fit/collaboration. They are a "Student Affairs" area, but we currently are working with Tutoring and Academic Technology as "hybrid" APRs that have SA features/connections/funding. Perhaps we could see whether there is PR funding through ASA that would support that kind of collaboration? We can bring this up at the next APROC meeting in early April but maybe at the same time you could get a better sense of the faculty working across these areas and their plans for APR? (Is Media Arts getting ready to begin its self-study?)
