Academic Program Review (APR) & APROC: What's New?

Lane Community College's Academic Program Review Process is now in its 8th year, and we have much to celebrate. The Academic Program Review Oversight Committee has shepherded 19 programs from three different pandemic cohorts through Stage 1: The Self Study, and 7 programs through the Implementation Steering Team Process during AY 2021/22, which means 67% of Lane's academic programs—both CTE and Fields of Study (FOS)—have completed the self-study phase of APR. By the end of AY 2022/23, the completion figure for Stage 1 will rise to 76% (53 of 70 programs) (see the charts, below, for data about the status of CTE and FOS). To date, over 250 faculty have participated in the APR process.

Meet the 2022/2023 APR Cohort

The centerpiece of the APR process is its self-study, which is organized around 5-6 inquiry questions and the generation and evaluation of data from a variety of sources, including the expertise of an external peer reviewer. This year, we have seven programs stepping into the self-study stage of program review (2 CTE programs and 5 FOS). See the list below and note the Program Review Committee (PRC) leads.





Important Updates



Between AYS 2020/21 and 2021/22 we've worked to systematize the APR process and create an infrastructure to support faculty work, which has led to the development of: a 10-Year Schedule; a system for data collection and reporting for CTE programs; a Masterlist of Inquiry Themes; a robust survey for faculty leads (see the 2022 response from one question, below); a data repository for tracking the recommendations that emerge from the self-study and external peer reviewer's visit (see the word cloud, below, of recommendations 2015-2021); a scope of work chart that delineates the intersection of assessment with Program Review.



Beginning AY 2022/23, APR will shift to a six-year process, which includes the stages listed below. Check out the <u>10-Year Master Schedule</u> to see when a program is next scheduled to step into the self study stage.
