universities that most students transfer to.



# Leading by Example: Regionally & Statewide

- Ethnic Studies at Lane Community College was originally designed during the 1969-70 academic year as Afro-American Studies. It expanded to become what is believed to be the first Ethnic Studies program of its kind in all of the Pacific Northwest four- and twoyear institutions of higher education.
- The Ethnic Studies program at Lane Community College continues to be the only large scale attempt to offer this curriculum in the entire Oregon community college system.
- All Ethnic Studies courses have been structured to meet Social Science (Arts and Letters) and Cultural Literacy graduation and/or transfer criteria. Because of this, Ethnic Studies courses fulfill requirements for students working on a wide range of degrees and certificates.
