Responses in which students saw themselves and their Latino culture as inferior due to the story of Whiteness, and its impact.

There are people who are fighting to change these stereotypical and discriminatory views and to change this world. (2008)

My favorite topic was about civilization and how they try to "civilize" us. This is what interested me most, and that's the type of information I want to know. Because I know that they don't like our culture, but I have no idea how they're trying to do it, or what our schools are teaching. (2008)

Responses in which students expressed appreciation for existing information, although present, never, revealed to students. This occurred through presentations from community members or from students who felt safe to share their stories in class.

Responses in which students felt empowerment to actions/changes to attitudes based on the stories shared by others who have successfully navigated a bicultural existence in predominately White spaces.

That we should speak up when we are put down! We should take back what is rightfully our ancestors! I liked this whole program because it showed me that there are really many people who are fighting for our people. (2008)

My favorite topics during P.A.L.A. were the ones about immigrant rights and those covered during the second and third week because they were a lot of fun. (2008)

I think that we should have a talent show next year and invite all the cultures that are here that are here at L.C.C. To show them what all the Latinos can do. Show them what we do our culture. Like sing a dance, a play ect. Something that the other groups can see what we do and we see what they do in their culture. (2008)

I have learned to people can't tell me what to do and what not to do. My favorite topic was racism and politics, they interest me so much. (2008)

The things I like were when the professors came and talked about where they came from and what they had to face and accomplish to reach their goal. Also I liked the videos they showed us about what happed to the people from different lands and how they spoke up in their own way. (2008)

And I like the videos that they showed us. (2008)
