- -Of the 153 Fall 2000 cohort, 52 (34%) had earned either a certificate or degree from Lane within fours of their starting term.
- -Of the 153 Fall 2000 cohort, 67 (44%) had transferred to another institution within four years of their starting term.
- -Of those in the cohort who had not earned an award or had not transferred, 47 (31%) had earned at least 45 credits with a GPA of 2.00 or better by the end of four years after their starting term.
- -Of the remaining cohort, two (1%) were still enrolled at Lane at the end of four years.
- -Of the 153 Fall 2000 cohort, a total of 142 (93%) were successful or persisting after four years.
