

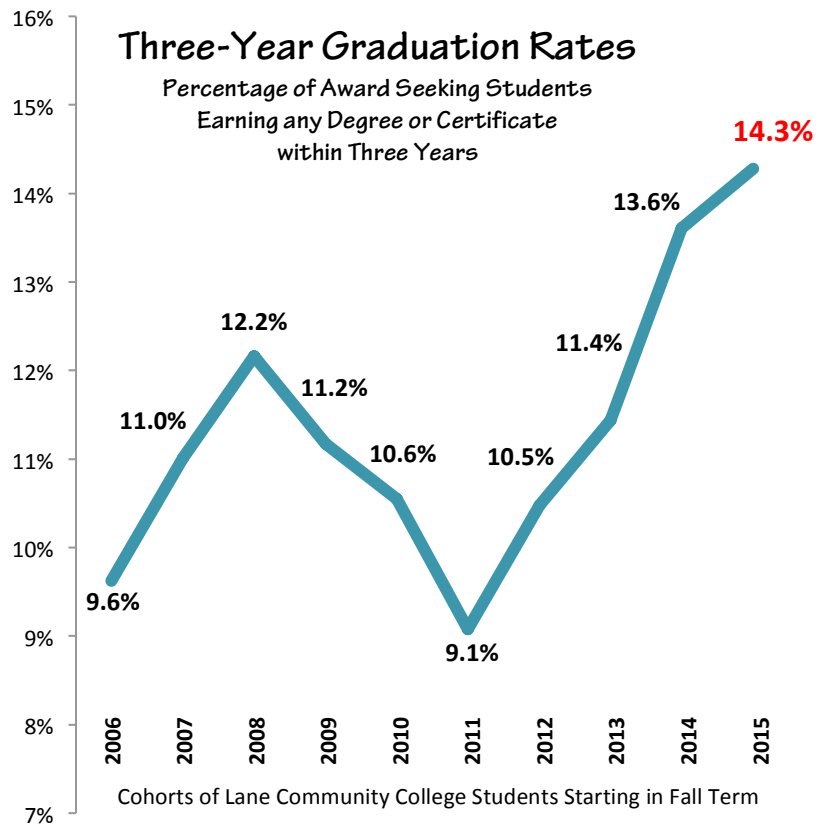
Graduation Rates over Time and by Student Characteristics

How likely are students to achieve a goal of graduation at Lane Community College? This chart shows three-year graduation rates for each of Lane’s most recent ten cohorts of fall start, award seeking students. Variation seen here is partially driven by enrollment and economic cycles outside Lane’s control. Still, the recent trend reflects well on college efforts to promote student success.

Lane’s three-year graduation rate has risen for each of the four most recent cohorts, reaching a ten-year high of 14.3%.

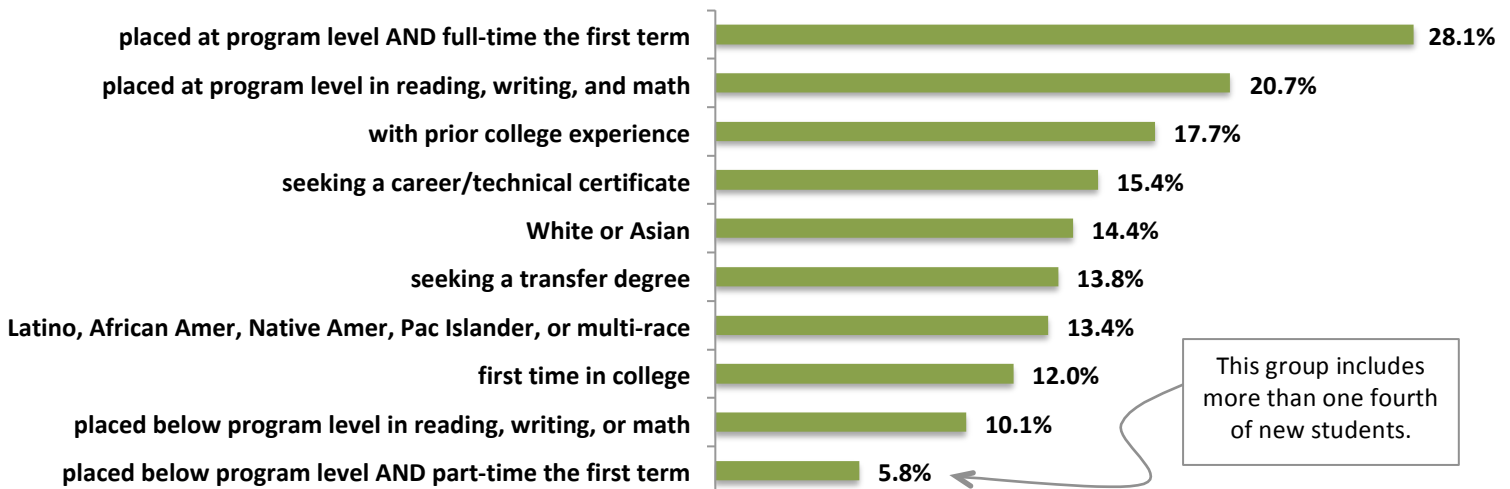
Compared to fall 2011, an award seeking student new to Lane in fall 2015 was 57% more likely to graduate within three years.

On the other hand, we may ask whether 14.3% is entirely satisfactory and view with concern the much lower graduation rates of some groups of Lane students.
